The English department chooses its summer reading titles based on literary merit and relevance of the texts to what we will study in the coming year, and with attention to a variety of perspectives and genres. Students should come to school in the fall prepared to talk about and work with the texts they read.

<u>Sometimes these books contain material that may be controversial or upsetting.</u> We encourage students to engage in dialogue with a trusted adult or mentor about any content they may find disturbing or difficult. <u>Please read the summary of each book, both required and recommended, carefully previous to starting your summer reading.</u>

NOTE: These links DO NOT indicate the editions you should buy or companies you should purchase your books from. They are there just to provide information and context on the stories themselves. There is no restriction on what edition or version of texts you read for either the required or recommended summer readings. You may use an edition that you already own or purchase a book or an ebook from any store or online retailer that you choose.
